We realize the importance of securing the services of a very able man with a few years of teaching experience, possibly one of your most promising instructors or an outstanding graduate. In view of the fact that the incumbent would have considerable responsibility we propose to offer him a starting salary of \$5,800 to \$6,500 a year according to qualifications, with every possibility of subsequent raises. He would have a month's vacation, and would be expected to teach one or more summer courses. He should be prepared to start work in the fall of 1959. I would appreciate your letting me know of any possible candidates as soon as possible.

We would arrange to have the most promising candidates come to Washington for an interview, or else a member of our staff could arrange to go to Chicago (unless there is a convention of designers at which we can send a representative of the Gallery to meet candidates).
